In addition, due to my background in natural sciences I would also be able to foster communication with people and institutions inside and outside the social and human sciences, as an attempt to bring together people from different fields. This should be possible also via the Portuguese NGO APCM - Sea Sciences Association (https://cienciasmar.wixsite.com/associacao) of which I am a founding member and that is composed by marine biologists, environmental historians, and artists as photographers. An example of a collaborative and interdisciplinary work is the H2020-MSCA-RISE CONCHA project (https://www.cham.fcsh.unl.pt/ext/concha/).

I also plan to contribute to the promotion of science communication, both to general and specialized public. In this sense, I will be completely available to design and organize ESEH events, material, and different types of content, making a good use of social media, newsletters and (presential and virtual) meetings.

Finally, a note about the United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development 2021-2030. This will be an opportunity for Environmental Historians - in fact, for all Humanities scientists - to assume their role and contribution to marine environmental changes and challenges.
