

Turku Book Award 2015

The European Society for Environmental History (ESEH) and the Rachel Carson Center for Environment and Society (RCC) are pleased to announce the Turku Book Award in environmental history. The Turku Book Award is intended to identify and encourage innovative and well-written scholarship in the field of environmental history and carries a prize of € 3,000. The prize will be awarded at the Eighth Biennial ESEH Conference held in Versailles, France, on 30 June-3 July 2015.

To be eligible, books must be single-author and have been published in 2013 or 2014. Books may be nominated by authors, publishers, or members of the ESEH. Preference will be given to books that focus on Europe and/or to authors who are affiliated with European institutions.

Applicants are asked to submit three copies of the monograph by mail to the Rachel Carson Center in Munich, as well as a digital copy (preferably a PDF file) to assistants@carsoncenter.lmu.de. If the monograph is written in a language other than English, please include a one-page English summary.

Monographs must be received by **15 January 2015**. The committee consists of:
