Summer Schools



- ESEH co-sponsors at least one summer school with an environmental history theme each year

- 2017: 'Natural and cultural heritage under different governments', Zadar, Croatia, 4-7 July

Travel grants



- ESEH supports young, unemployed/underemployed, and other low income scholars who need financial assistance to attend the biennial conference
- Selected 29 grant recipients out of 32 applicants
- Grants for €7975 (from €150 to €500 for each)
- Plus travel support for Regional Representatives with financial need

- New initiative added by the Board from 2015

- The Turku Book Award identifies and encourages innovative and well-written scholarship in the field of environmental history and carries a prize of €3,000

St Andrews Article Prize



- Given an official name for the 2017 award
- To identify and encourage innovative and well written research in the field of environmental history of Europe. Articles on any subject in European environmental history and in any European language are eligible for the award
- €500 plus biennial conference fee

- 35 articles submitted for 2017

Environment and History poster prize



- First given at 2015 conference
- To encourage and elevate the status of poster presentations at the biennial conference
- White Horse Press is sponsoring the prize
- First and second prizes to be awarded (€100/€50)
