

Call for Papers
**Israeli Sixth Annual Conference
For Environmental History**

The Israeli Forum for Environmental History is inviting researchers to submit proposals for the Sixth Annual Conference in Environmental History. The conference will take place on February 10th, 2020, in the Porter School of Environment and Earth Studies at Tel Aviv University.

The theme for 2020 conference is “Wild.” The organizing committee welcomes paper proposals that are related to this theme, broadly conceived. Papers could discuss, for example, the dichotomy between wild and domesticated; the definition of “wild” and the changes it underwent across time and place; local and global issues of domestication; reintroduction and rewilding of species; the politics of the wilderness; power relations in nature conservation; the movement of organisms between urban and wild places; social struggles for nature preservation and so on.

Other proposals in environmental history, unrelated to the theme of Wild, will be also considered, including, but not limited to, environmental theory; human-animal relations; nature design; environment and economical systems; climate change; environmental sciences; social movements and more.

Researchers in all stages are invited to submit proposals for individual papers, panels or roundtables. Proposals for individual papers should be limited to 250 words and to include the presenter’s name, affiliation and contact details. Panel proposals should include up to three presentations limited to 250 words each, names, affiliation and contact details of all speakers. In addition, panel proposals should indicate a moderator and a chair. Roundtable proposals should include an abstract and the details of at least four speakers, including the organizer’s.

The organizing committee regrets that it is unable to provide any financial assistance to participants.
